The first strip of concrete pavement reaches the bottom of Klehm's Hill. Traffic is now using the concrete pavement near the top of the hill. Overall this work is nearly half finished.

Highlights

Sealing on Efate reaches the 48 km peg near Epule Quarry. Sealing equipment barged to Santo.

Santo Planned Work

Pavement construction has reached the 33 km peg and will continue progressing North of Velit Bay. After the equipment arrives on a barge from Efate, sealing will recommence this week and the stretch between the 17 km peg and 34 km peg is expected to be sealed while the equipment is on Santo.

Efate Planned Work

Clearing and widening work will continue to progress towards Pangpang. Side drains and pavement will be constructed between Elu and Pangpang. Pavement overlay will continue between Epau Village and Elu.

Traffic Cautions

Traffic flows on Klehm's Hill will continue to be restricted to one lane while the guardrail and concrete pavement is constructed. Twenty-four hour traffic control will be in place and road users are urged to comply with the safety signs and the directions of the traffic controllers on site. Again, we ask all drivers to refrain from speeding. The roads are construction sites and used by pedestrians as well as vehicles.
